Important Reminders:

LEAGUE-WIDE FORMAT CHANGE 601 Triples is now 501 Doubles

Beginning in the **Spring 2011** season, MMDL will be replacing the two 3-on-3 601 games with three doubles 501, DIDO, single leg in ALL DIVISIONS. A significant percentage of the league membership has expressed strong feelings in support of this change and the Board of Directors has made the difficult decision to amend the format. In addition, this adjustment will result in a new order of play, including a shot for cork to see who goes first in the doubles 501.

NOTE: Unless done for a rubber match (third leg tiebreaker), the team listed under the shot for cork shoots first and DOES NOT have choice for who shoots first.

MATCH ORDER OF PLAY AND SCOREKEEPING:

501 Doubles / Double-In, Double-Out / Single Leg

1. 501 Game One **Away** for Cork first (not choice), Away keeps score
2. 501 Game Two **Home** for Cork first (not choice), Home keeps score
3. 501 Game Three **Away** for Cork first (not choice), Away keeps score

Cricket Doubles / Single Leg (Best of Three in Super A Division Only)

4. Cricket Game One **Home** for Cork first (not choice), Home keeps score
5. Cricket Game Two **Away** for Cork first (not choice), Away keeps score
6. Cricket Game Three **Home** for Cork first (not choice), Home keeps score

301 Singles / Double-In, Double-Out / Best of Three

(Loser of first leg starts second leg, winner of first leg has choice for cork to start third leg, if necessary)

7. 301 Game One **Away** to Start w/shoot for Double-On, Away keeps score
8. 301 Game Two **Home** to start w/shoot for Double-On, Home keeps score
9. 301 Game Three **Away** to start w/shoot for Double-On, Away keeps score
10. 301 Game Four **Home** to start w/shoot for Double-On, Home keeps score
11. 301 Game Five **Away** to start w/shoot for Double-On, Away keeps score
12. 301 Game Six **Home** to start. w/shoot for Double-On, Home keeps score

MATCH START TIME IS 7:30!

The official MMDL match start time is 7:30pm! On average, matches should be completed by 11pm. Start and end times of matches are to be recorded on the match report sheet.

REMINDER - PLAYER MINIMUMS

The minimum number of matches that a player must play in order to be eligible for the playoffs is three (3). The minimum number of players required to play a match is three (3).
